- 2. Is it easy to assume TRUTH and FACTS are the same thing? When you read the Bible, are you more interested in finding TRUTH or counting FACTS?
- 3. Can we only use a literal (meaning, "by the exact words") approach to interpreting the Bible? Or is there another path to understanding scripture?
- 4. How do we translate scripture to life and experience? How does the Bible guide you in loving God and neighbor, and in living a life of faith, hope, and love?
- 5. Let's try this one again, in one sentence answer this question: What is the Bible?
