Knoxville native limmy Sherrod has been serving the United Methodist Church in song and in word since 1997, when he was still a student at the University of Tennessee. His great-aunt Dot, a lifelong member of Pleasant Hill UMC in east Knox County, asked Jimmy to play the piano for a senior citizens' event at her church, and the rest is history. Jimmy has had an opportunity throughout his career to use his gift of music to direct choirs, work for Preacher J. Bazzel Mull at his radio station, sing in Southern Gospel quartets, lead praise bands, and lead music for the Holston Annual Conference and the Baltimore/Washington Annual Conference, as well as at special events such as the annual Sulphur Springs Camp Meeting near Johnson City.
